Work experience in conservation and land stewardship.

Do you enjoy nature? Do you enjoy working in nature? Do you enjoy working to preserve nature? So do we! And we have a great opportunity for you!

In the Youth Environmental Stewardship, or YES, program, participants get their hands dirty, literally! Up to 12 teens will work with Trellis staff, and our partners, learning how to care for and protect our natural places, as well as make them accessible for all to enjoy. Projects include, but aren't limited to: invasive species removal, tree planting, trail maintenance, waterbar installation, and beautification projects. Not familiar with some (or all) of these projects? No worries, participants also engage in environmental education. For example, you'll learn what an invasive species is, and why they need to be removed. In addition, participants explore a variety of career options in conservation, and not just the obvious career paths. You learn about the "behind the scenes" jobs, like grant writing and social media specialist, as well.
